Not Acceptable

- No electronic waste (batteries, cell phones, computers, etc.)
- No paint, pesticides, oil & cleansers
- No motor oil or antifreeze containers
- No organic material and food waste
- No waxed paper or waxed cardboard
- No Styrofoam™ or paper to-go containers
- No plastic caps
- No hard cover books

PLEASE NOTE:

Village residents are asked not to flush certain items down their drains (sinks, toilets, tubs etc.), paper towels, napkins, diapers, baby wipes, other wipes such as Clorox, Windex, etc., ladies' products, cloth or any similar-type materials.

These items are commonly found in the Village sewer system and cause blockages in the system, which can result in sewer backups in homes, businesses and other facilities.

Village Compost Site

The Village Compost Site is located at the D.P.W. Garage on Bachelor Street. The hours of operation are 7 a.m. until 3 p.m. Monday through Friday and Saturdays 9 a.m. until 2 p.m. This is for Village residents only and not commercial dumping. The Village will pickup curbside for a nominal fee. Please make arrangement with the D.P.W. at 457-5321. This applies for bulk pickup as well, which can be picked up curbside for a fee.

Village of Montgomery DPW

Effective June 1, 2018 the Village of Montgomery will require village businesses to begin using a new 95 gallon garbage cans that will be available for purchase at the DPW building beginning May 23, 2018.

The price of the new cans will be \$100 and will include the village logo along with a serial number for identification. The new cans hold up to 330/lbs. of refuse. The village is currently retrofitting our new garbage truck to mechanically pick up the new cans and deposit the contents into the truck. This will speed up garbage pick-up and result in less injuries for our workers.

As of June 1st, only garbage that is in the approved can, will be picked up.

Concerns with Pleasure Ground Parkland Workers

There has been some concern lately about the Orange County inmates working in the Pleasure Ground Parkland. A few residents have voiced their concerns, and hopefully we can allay those concerns. The Village of Montgomery has used the Orange County Jail inmates numerous times over the past thirty years. These inmates are not hardened criminals imprisoned for violent felonies

or more serious crimes. They are mostly individuals who are due to be released in the very near future. They are minimum security inmates. The Orange County Jail inmates built our present day police station (before renovations) and helped build much of the Village Trail system we enjoy today. They also helped clear much of the Pleasure Ground Parkland of brush, trees and refuse as well as

mulching along many of the trails.

The Village of Montgomery saved tens of thousands of dollars with the assistance of this labor. We would not put our residents, and especially our children, in harms way. Scheduling is done when less public interaction will take place. We are sorry for any fears or misunderstanding this might have caused.

Brown Water Issues and Annual Hydrant Flushing

The Village of Montgomery continues to work diligently on the brown water issue. The groundwater under direct influence testing was completed in February 2018 (after more than one year of testing). The results were negative, which is good news. The proposed filtration system was sent to the Orange County

Health Department on March 27th for review. Comments and concerns were returned to the Village by the Health Department and are being addressed in short order. The Village is hopeful that O.C. Health Dept. will approve the proposal in the near future. Then construction of the filtration system can begin.

Many residents had brown water during the hydrant flushing during the weeks of April 16th and 23rd. This will almost always happen during the flushing. The flushing is done to rid water lines of sediment, which are natural in water systems. This is also to prevent brown water in the first place.

Village Landscaping

The Village plans landscaping, curbing, fencing and asphalt improvements behind the Village Hall and in the Municipal Parking Lot.

In addition, the roof at the Historic Museum will be replaced. This work will be completed this year as well as curbing improvements at the intersection of Union and Clinton Streets.

Bulk Pickup

Stop by the Village Hall 133 Clinton Street 457-9661 to make arrangements to have your bulk items picked up.

There is a nominal fee for the pick up. After you have paid at the Village Hall, the DPW will pick up your items.
