


# **Reverend Paul M. Milz Retiring**



### Water costs money ... don't waste it!

A dripping faucet or fixture can waste 3 gallons a day...a total of 1095 gallons a year.

#### Top 10 WAYS TO PROTECT AND **CONSERVE GROUNDWATER**

- 1. Dispose of chemicals properly.
- 2. Take used motor oil to recycling center.
- 3. Limit amounts of fertilizer.
- 4. Take short showers.
- 5. Shut water off while bushing teeth.
- 6. Run full loads of dishes and laundry.
- 7. Check for leaky faucets and have them fixed.
- 8. Water outside only when necessary.

9. Keep a pitcher of drinking water in the refrigerator. 10. Be involved in water education.

A one time 10% penalty will be added after the due date.
